### **2003 Freshman Student Profile Office of Institutional Research Elisabeth Ervin-Blankenheim, Director**

#### Introduction

The 2003 Freshman Student Profile Survey was scheduled and administered on Friday August 22<sup>nd</sup> from 2 p.m. to 3 p.m. as part of the Welcome Week activities. A total of 180 freshmen completed the questionnaire answering the majority of the questions. Freshmen on sports team were given the survey at a different time because of the practice and scrimmage schedule. One hundred and twelve (112) freshmen on teams filled out the survey. Additionally, 70 surveys were sent to freshmen commuter students. This mailing was an attempt to have more complete response from the new commuter students who may not have attended the Week of Welcome activities. Of the 70 commuter surveys, 13 were returned (18.6%). A total of 305 freshman surveys were completed out of the total in the class of 440, thus 69.3% of the freshman class participated and completed the survey. This number compares similarly to the survey return rate of 70.3% in 2002.

Student responses to the questionnaire are used to provide a general summary of Delaware Valley College's 2003 freshman class. This summary is presented below. Charts depicting student responses to each of the questions are presented on pages 9 through 17. The survey was modified slightly from last year's survey. The order of the questions was changed to improve the flow of the survey. Questions concerning extra-curricular activities and sports participation were moved later in the survey. In addition questions were added regarding if the student planned to have a car on campus during the fall semester (Question 4), which radio station, if any, the student listens to (Question 24), and if placement test(s) indicated a need for remedial courses did the student take those courses over the summer (Question 33). Several questions were deleted from the previous Freshman Survey in 2002, namely those that asked if the student is familiar with the services of a Counseling Center and a Tutoring Center.

### **2003 Freshman Student Profile—Summary**

#### **On- and Off-campus Information**

- The majority of freshmen (89.5%) stated that they will be living on campus, while 2.0% reported they will be living off-campus in a private home, apartment or room; 8.2% said they will be living off-campus with family or a relative and <1% stated they were living off-campus in college housing (Question 1).
- A majority of freshmen answered they anticipate going home 2 to 3 weekends per month, 38.0%, and 32.0% anticipate going home 1 weekend per month, 13.0% plan to go home less than one weekend a month, and 16.5% anticipate going home every weekend (Question 2).

- Most freshmen (33.8%) reported that their home is between 50 and 100 miles, 6.9% reported that their home is less than 10 miles away, 28.8% state that their home is between 11 and 50 miles from DVC, 29.2% report that their home is between 100 and 500 miles away, and 1.3% state their home is more than 500 miles away (Question 3).
- Fifty-nine point seven (59.7) percent of freshmen say they will have a car on campus this fall (Question 4).

### **Selection of DVC, Family Background, and Plans for Further Study**

- Thirty-two point two (32.2) percent of the freshmen reported that they learned about DVC from an alumni or friend while 6.6% learned of the college by the web page. Ten point eight (10.8) percent learned of DVC from the mail or a brochure, 12.5% learned of DVC through a High School Counselor, and 37.8% learned about DVC from other sources (Question 5).
- Sixty-two point two (62.2) percent of the freshmen indicated Delaware Valley College was their first choice of college and 26.6% stated that Delaware Valley College was their second choice (Question 6).
- Fifty-four point three (54.3) percent of the freshmen reported that the most important factor in the selection of Delaware Valley College was because the college had their major of interest. The next most important factors to these students were location of the college (16.6%), tuition assistance (12.6%), career opportunities (9.9%), and reputation of the college (6.6%) (Question 7).
- Forty-four point six (49.2) percent of those freshmen responded that neither of their parents is a college graduate, 27.5% stated that one parent is a college graduate and 23.3% stated that both parents are college graduates (Question 8).
- Fifty-six point five (56.5) percent of the freshmen stated that they are not the first in their immediate family to attend college (Question 9).
- Thirty-eight point seven (38.7) percent of the freshmen reported they have one sibling, 28.2% responded they have two siblings, 22.6% reported they have three or more siblings, and 10.5% reported they are only children (Question 10).
- Thirty-six point zero (36.0) percent of the freshmen reported that they are either the oldest or youngest child in their family, 20.1% stated that they are the middle child, and 7.9% are the only child (Question 11).
- Three point six (3.6) percent of the freshmen said they plan to obtain an Associate's degree, 49.3% stated they plan to obtain a Bachelor's degree, 27.3% stated they plan to obtain a Master's degree, 18.1% said they plan to continue on for a Doctorate degree, and 1.8% reported they are interested in attaining a degree not listed above (Question 12).

### **Study Skills, Needs and Use of Student Support Services**

- Sixty-one point four (61.4) percent of the freshmen responded that they were planning on holding a job that ranged from 10 to 20 hours per week while in college; 25.1% said they did not plan to work and the remainder, 13.5%, were planning on working more than 20 hours per week (Question 13).

- The majority of the freshmen (64.4%) stated that they plan to study in their residence hall room, 18.6% anticipated studying predominantly in the library, 15.0% planned to study in “other” locations and 2.0% planned to study in the lounge of their residence hall (Question 14).
- Sixty-three point two (63.2) percent of the freshmen stated that they are somewhat familiar with library research, 26.6% said they are very familiar with library research and 10.2% stated they are not familiar with library research (Question 15).
- Seventy-one point three (71.3) percent of the freshmen reported that they prefer to study alone rather than in a group (Question 16).
- Most of the freshmen (51.3%) answered that they are unlikely to attend a study skills workshop (Question 17).
- Fifty-one point zero (51.0) percent of the freshmen stated they had used the services of a Counseling Center in the past (Question 30). Thirty-nine point six (39.6) percent of freshmen said they had used a Counseling Center for career or college counseling, 11.6% reported they used it for career/college counseling and personal problems, 6.0% said they used it mainly for personal problems, 3.3% reported they used it for other reasons, and the majority (42.2%) said they had not used the services of a Counseling Center at all (Question 31).
- The majority of freshmen (76.3%) said they had not used Tutoring Center services in the past (Question 32).
- Thirteen point six (13.6) percent of the freshmen, if their placement tests had indicated they needed one or more remedial courses, had taken those remedial courses over the summer (Question 33).

### **Extra-curricular activities and sports participation**

- Eighty-seven point nine (87.9) percent of the freshmen stated that they participated in extra-curricular activities while in high school (Question 25).
- Eighty-six point three (86.3) percent plan on participating in extra-curricular activities while in college (Question 26).
- Most of the freshmen, 67.0% participated on high school varsity teams (Question 27).
- Fifty-three point five (53.5) percent stated they plan to participate in intercollegiate sports while in college (Question 28).
- The majority of the freshmen, 60.7%, stated they do not plan to participate in intramural sports while in college (Question 29).

### **Demographics**

- Forty-one point six (41.6) percent of the freshmen responded they are female and 58.4% responded they are male (Question 37).
- Eighty-seven point eight (87.9) percent of the freshmen answered they are in the age range of 18 to 25 years, 10.5% are under 18 years old, and 1.6% range in age from 26-34 (Question 38).

- The group of freshmen surveyed is comprised of 87.4% White, non-Hispanic; 7.3% Black; 3.3% Hispanic; 1.3% Asian/Pacific Islander, and < 1% Native American (Question 39).
- Ninety-six point seven (96.7) percent of the freshmen reported that their marital status is single and 1.6% report they are married (Question 40).
- The majority of freshmen, 57.2%, reported they are Pennsylvania residents (Question 44).
- The majority of the freshmen, 70.2%, answered they do not have a working ability with a language other than English (Question 34).

### **High School Background**

- Most of the freshmen (79.7%) stated that they attended a public high school, 14.8% attended a private, religious high school, 4.9% attended a private, non-sectarian high school and <1% were home schooled (Question 41).
- Fifty-five point one (55.1) percent of the freshmen reported the high school they attended was in a suburban setting, 28.7% reported their high school was in a rural setting, and 13.9% said their high school was in an urban setting (Question 42).
- Twenty-nine point six (29.6) percent of the responding freshmen stated that their high school ranged in student population from between 1000 to 1500 students, 22.2% attended high schools from 1 to 500 students, 21.6% attended high schools from 501 to 999 students, and 26.6% attended high schools with more than 1501 students (Question 43).

### **Computer/Media Usage**

- Fifty-seven point seven (57.7) percent of freshmen stated they are familiar somewhat with computers, 39.3% reported they are very familiar with computers, and 3.0% said they were not familiar with computers (Question 18).
- Seventy-one point eight (71.8) percent of the freshmen reported they were unlikely to attend a computer-training workshop (Question 19).
- A majority of freshmen (87.8%) stated they will be using their own computers while a student (Question 20).
- Most of the freshmen (45.1%) said they used email at least once a day, 27.0% stated they used email several times a week, 14.1% said they used email once a week, 8.2% said they used email several times a month, and 5.6% reported they do not use email at all (Question 21).
- Fifty-nine point eight (59.8) percent of the freshmen said they used television as their primary source of information, 21.6% reported they used the Internet as their main information source, 8.3% stated they listened to the radio as their primary source of information, 7.0% reported they read the newspaper as their main information source, and 3.3% responded that they used none of the above as their main source of information (Question 22).
- The majority of freshmen, 23.8% percent said they read local newspapers 16.2% reported they read other newspapers, 15.6% stated they read regional newspapers,

13.2% stated they read national newspapers, and 31.1% reported they did not read newspapers (Question 23).

- Sixty-two point two (62.2) percent of the freshmen stated they do not listen to a particular radio station, 15.9% reported they listen to Y100 100.3, 10.0% reported they listen to PST 97.5, and 6.0% each stated they listen to WMMR 93.3 and WYSP 94.1 (Question 24).

### **Use of Tobacco and Alcohol**

- Eighty-four point one (84.1) percent of the freshmen reported that they did not smoke cigarettes (Question 35).
- Fifty-five point eight (55.8) percent of the freshmen responding to the survey stated they did not drink alcohol, 27.7% identified themselves as moderate drinkers when describing their alcohol consumption at any given “party” or over a typical two week period, and 16.5% said they were heavy drinkers when describing their alcohol consumption at any given “party” or over a typical two week period (Question 36).
