

ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The American Bar Association (ABA) clearly states there is no official "pre-law" curriculum and that students are admitted to law school from a variety of academic majors. Nevertheless, there are important skills, knowledge and experience that the ABA recommends acquiring prior to law school and that will provide a good foundation for a legal education. The Pre-law minor assures that students acquire the skills, knowledge, and experience recommended by the ABA such as problem-solving, critical language skills, background information, research and data analysis, and exposure to law, that will help them apply to and complete Law School.

Students from any major at DelVal have the option of declaring a minor in Pre-law through the Interdisciplinary program. Moreover, the Pre-law minor was designed so that students may choose courses that fulfill both the requirements for the minor and for the Core Curriculum program. Additionally, all students in the minor must take a Pre-law Capstone course where the aforementioned skills and knowledge are practiced and assessed and where students will have the opportunity to interact with experts in the legal system.
