As recommended by current DelVal students, pack lightly for your initial move-in day. You may not need all that you think you need.

PERSONAL ITEMS

- Extra-long twin sheets
- Pillow, egg crate cushion, comforter
- Toiletries, shower caddy, shower shoes
- Clothes hangers
- Cleaning supplies
- Clothing hamper or bag; HE detergent only

UTILITY ITEMS

- Power strip - UL Certified
- Floor rug - 8x10 or less
- Small fan
- Small trash can, with trash bags
- Flashlight, with batteries
- Desk lamp – non-halogen
- Refrigerator – 3.1cf or less
- Water-boiling pitchers, Keurig – must have enclosed heating elements
- Plug-ins air fresheners

ORGANIZATION AND OFFICE

- Calendar and alarm clock if not on phone
- Clear plastic containers for food
- Printer paper
- 3M Command products for hanging items and decor
- Posters, pictures
- Small standing shelves, seating
- Small live plants
- Curtains

FOR THE SAFETY OF EACH STUDENT AND THE COMMUNITY, THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE NOT PERMITTED IN THE RESIDENCE HALLS:

- × Air conditioners not supplied by the University
- × Grills and associated items, including charcoal, lighter fluid, propane gas and other flammable substances
- × Motor vehicles and auto repair materials, including but not limited to gas cans, motor oil and engines
- × Battery-operated personal transport devices and/or their batteries, such as hoverboards and powered scooters
- × Weapons, firearms, ammunition, or any other dangerous projectiles, including BB guns, pellet guns, power-water guns, electric stun devices and replicas
- × Non-UL-Certified power strips and extension cords
- × Any flammable or incendiary material including candles, incense, wax warmers, fireworks, or explosives
- × Inflatable hot tubs
- × Water beds
- × Dart boards
- × Halogen lamps and heating lamps
- × Space heaters and electric blankets
- × Fish tanks larger than 10 gallons
- × Pets other than fish
- × Cut plants, such as natural Christmas trees and wreaths, live potted trees and hay bales
- × Microwaves‡
- × Any cooking appliance with an exposed coil or hot plate (toasters, toaster ovens, air fryers, deep fryers, drip coffee-makers*, electric kettles**)
- × Wet specimen collections
- × Taxidermy supplies including but not limited to tools, chemicals and preservatives.
